## Woman dies in leap from North D bridge

. The death of a 66-year-old woman who was found under the North D Street Bridge Monday afternoon has been ruled a suicide, according to Wayne County Coroner Dr. John M. Wambo.

Martha Jane Fienning, Jenkins Hall, Reid Memorial Hospital, apparently jumped from the bridge about 4:18 p.m. She was found by police lying in the southbound lane of Sim Hodgin Parkway.

AID Ambulance rushed Miss Fienning to Reid Memorial Hospital where she was pronounced dead on arrival at 4:31 p.m. Wambo said Miss Fienning died from internal injuries sustained in the fall.

According to investigators, Miss Fienning had reportedly been depressed and in considerable pain due to medical problems.
