

Born September 2, 1881, at Visinga which is close to Osnabruck, Germany. Mother: Katherine Louisa Bode Fienning (no relation to Richmond Bode) Father: John Henry Fienning. Worked on a farm 6 miles from town. Herman Tieman worked with him on Sudhoff farm. (Clara and Martha Tieman, daughters of Herman) Ralph Tubesing is son of Clara Tieman.

Twin boys died at birth in Germany
Charles (7 years older than George) died at 73
Mary died in Germany
Elizabeth died in 1963 at 85
George died November 23, 1965 at 84
Younger sister died in Germany

John worked in foundry at Gaar-Scott. Died after 1 year and 4 months in this country of typhiod fever at 36 years.

Married Frances Charlotte Von Pein(February 2, 1882, birthday)

Frances died October 17, 1918, of influenza. Left 9 children, 5 boys,
4 girls.

Married Sophia Fredericka Von Pein (Birthday: October 22, 1879) on November 26, 1919. Ricka died April 8, 1969. She had one son: Rudolph.

George was 6 years old on arrival in this country. He came three years after Tiemans left Germany for U. S. It took 13 days to sail from Germany to Baltimore.

He had five years of schooling at St. John's Lutheran School, Rev. Feeger, teacher.

At 13 years of age, worked for Bill Duning in bicycle shop for \$1 per week, later \$1.50 a week.

At 14 went to work at Starr Piano at \$2.00 and worked for 10 years. Earned \$17.50 to 18.00 a week by time he left. Left because of ill health-developed a bad cold while setting up a pipe organ at Gennett's.

Built up own A&P route for 4 years, 3 months. A&P furnished horse and wagon. Started Grocery June 28, 1901, with Oscar Nolte.
